PAUSED and checked for pregnancy and breastfeeding in Nuclear Medicine

Р	Patient	Does the patient fall within the risk group identified within local inclusive pregnancy checking procedures? Is the patient currently/planning to start breast/chest feeding?
Α	Assess referral	Is there any information to suggest the possibility of pregnancy? Has the patient consented to their gender history being recorded?
U	Use the right environment and language	Do you have a private and psychologically safe environment? Is there a private space for the patient to complete the required form(s) and ask the radiographer any questions? Are staff trained in the use of gender inclusive language?
S	Sharing of information	Confirm patient identification and preferred name and pronouns. Explain why the information about sex registered at birth and pregnancy is important – 'This procedure/treatment uses ionising radiation, which could be harmful to a pregnancy'. Discuss how this information may be shared and seek consent to do so. Only ask about gender-affirming procedures and variation in sex characteristics if relevant to possibility of pregnancy or breastfeeding. If the patient has a variation in sex characteristics, establish if there is any possibility of pregnancy.
Е	Enquire further	Where appropriate, follow local procedures for pregnancy testing. Where appropriate follow local procedures for breast/chest feeding.
D	Data recording	Discuss where and how the information is recorded and ensure the patient has consented to this. Ensure there is a procedure in the event the patient does not consent to the storage or sharing of sex or gender information.
